One Book, One Brant 20th Anniversary

2025 marked 20 years of CBPL's beloved community reads event. Over 200 patrons celebrated with us at bestselling author Emma Donoghue's visit and author talk in April.



In partnership with Therapeutic Paws of Canada, our new program **Paws to Read** quickly became a fan favourite.

We celebrated our first annual literary-themed gala, **Winter at Pemberley**, honoring Jane Austen's 250th birthday. Patrons enjoyed Regency-era crafts, learned period dancing, and put their knowledge to the test with trivia.

Free Period Products

In 2025, Brant Library began offering free menstrual products at all branches. This initiative is part of our commitment to period equity and improving access to essential resources for everyone in our community.

English Conversation Circle

ECC attendance jumped **116%** in 2025, leading to nearly three times more practice conversations than in 2024—and the momentum keeps building.



Wellness Drop-Ins

Introduced in 2025, Wellness Drop-Ins with the Sexual Assault Centre of Brant offer a supportive space for community members to explore wellness practices and concepts, while also accessing support related to sexual assault.

Our staff made **424** visits to local schools to promote early literacy!

CBPL was honoured with the prestigious **Angus Mowat Award for Service Excellence**, in recognition of our innovative and highly popular programs for seniors.

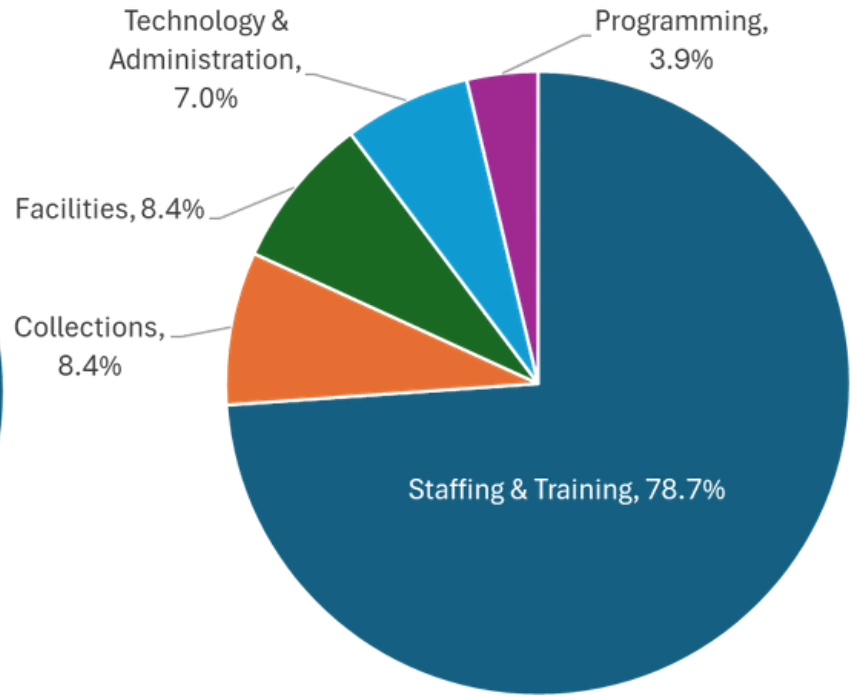
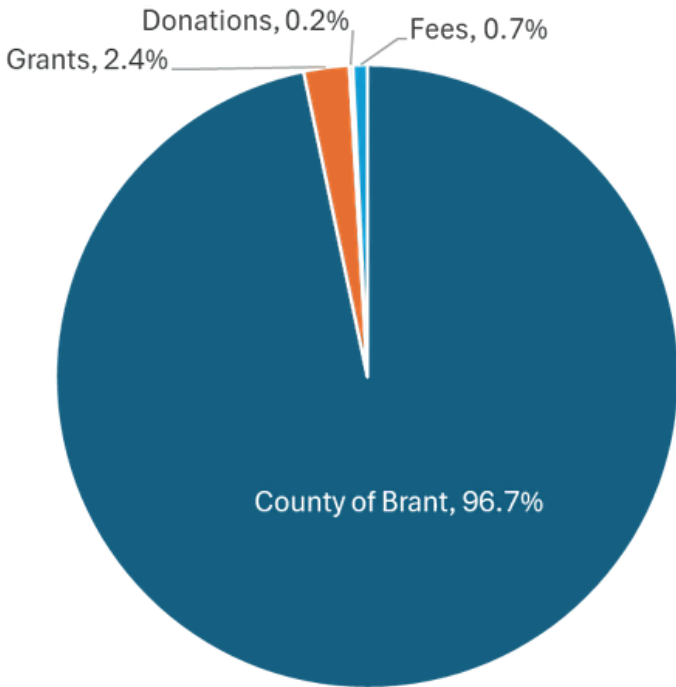
